

Ends to Bind

Or how I join my binding


1. Square off both ends.



8. Cut the pink binding on the fold.



2. Turn down one corner making a 45 degree angle.




9. Place the pink binding back on the blue.

10. Carefully, open

the pink binding


keeping the left edges even with

the blue edges.



edges align and it makes a sharp point. Press.

3. Open the fold




and draw a line along the fold line. Refold.


4. Press the entire length

lengthwise.




11. The blue and pink ends will be perpendicular to each other. Turn over so the drawn line is facing up. Pin across the line at the beginning.




5. Beginning with the 45 deg. fold end, apply binding leaving 6-8 inches free at the beginning end. Continue to sew the binding to the quilt as you normally would until you are 12-15 inches from where you began stitching. Now it is time to join the ends with no measuring.



12. Stitch on the line. Trim to 1/4 inch. Finger press the seam open.





15. Fold the binding in half, and you can now sew it to the quilt.

7. Fold excess pink binding back so it is even with the edge of the blue binding. Finger press the fold.
